- The school year is divided into two semesters of 18 weeks.
- The daily schedule is a modified block.
- All science classes are designed and taught as laboratory classes.
- Students are required to take seven classes per semester.
- Students are required to complete 9 hours of service per semester (effective 2020-2021 school year).

- In order to qualify for AP courses, students must go through a rigorous application process of teacher recommendations, assessment benchmarking, standardized test evaluation, and essay writing.
- CTK policy limits the amount of AP courses that students may take: one during sophomore year, and two each during junior and senior year. Occasionally, capable students are allowed to take three AP courses with administrative approval.
